## ACADEMIC COURSE OFFERINGS

IBDP and BTEC courses are offered to students in Grades 11-12. AP courses are offered to students from Grades 10-12. Stamford students are limited to taking a maximum of 4 AP courses per year. IB Diploma students are restricted to three Higher Level courses.

### GRADES 9 & 10 - IB Middle Years Programme (IBMYP)

All students in Grades 9 and 10 participate in the IB MYP. Grade 10 students are offered up to 2 AP courses if they wish to take them. All Grade 10 students participate in the MYP Personal Project and have the opportunity to sit for the MYP Certificate.

### GRADES 11 & 12 (IBDP, AP, BTEC or Individualized Pathway)

Academic counseling begins for students in Grade 9 and students are given an option to pursue a variety of academic pathways. Stamford is the first and only school in Singapore to offer the American Advanced Placement, BTEC Diploma and International Baccalaureate Diploma Curricula.

### INDIVIDUALIZED PATHWAY

Stamford students have the opportunity to take a blend of IB, BTEC and/or AP courses to work towards the Stamford High School Diploma. This offers flexibility and choice for students in choosing their courses and rigor. Students in the blended pathway also have the opportunity to take IB or AP external examinations. Students in the BTEC Diploma are more restricted to the courses they may take depending on the type of the diploma they are working towards.



### STAMFORD GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA) EQUIVALENCY

Students at Stamford are not ranked nor do we calculate GPA. For schools requiring GPA we suggest the following equivalency: students taking IBDP Standard Level (SL) and Theory of Knowledge (TOK) courses would be awarded a 0.5 weight per semester. Students taking IBDP Higher Level (HL) and AP courses would be awarded a 1.0 weight per semester. These weights would be due to the rigor of the courses.

### GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Total minimum credits to graduate is 24 credits: 1 credit equals 1 academic year of study + Service.

The majority of students will graduate in excess of the minimum graduation requirements. Students may not graduate early even if all credits are met.

### GRADING AND REPORTING

Progress grades are reported quarterly, and Final grades are reported on the transcript. Stamford uses the IB 1-7 Grading Scale for Stamford, MYP and DP courses, the AP 1-5 scale for AP courses, and the BTEC D-U scale. Precalculus (PreAP) uses the AP grading scale. The Theory of Knowledge course is reported as a P (Pass) or F (Fail) as we want the focus to be on feedback and student learning.

### COLLEGE COUNSELING POLICIES

The Stamford College Counseling department has a 10-school plan for college/university applications worldwide. The plan is to ensure that students practice "quality of choice" in researching and ultimately choosing the universities in which they apply for. Academic and college counselors support each student individually to ensure that they do proper research to realize what institutions have the potential to be the right "fit" for them. Whether it is a preference for a specific program, location or educational experience, we encourage Stamford students and parents to focus on "quality over quantity" when developing their college lists.

## IBDP RESULTS | CLASS OF 2022

IB Diploma candidates must also complete the IBDP Core, which consists of Theory of Knowledge (TOK), Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS), and the Extended Essay (EE). All students must complete CAS and TOK. Stamford HS Diploma students can choose to pursue IBDP Course Certificates, enabling them to sit selected IBDP examinations and not complete the Extended Essay. Stamford HS Diploma students have the option to take Global Perspectives as an alternative to Theory of Knowledge (TOK).

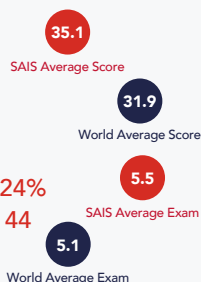
