FREEDOM TO CHOOSE

The FIRST and ONLY school in Singapore to offer Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IB DP) and Business and Technical Education Council (BTEC) Diploma curricula.

Choice. It's the foundation of any education. At Stamford American we inspire students to create their own unique future.

Stamford American offers students the unique opportunity to graduate with a US-accredited High School Diploma derived from a choice between the College Board's Advanced Placement International Diploma (AP ID) courses, the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IB DP), a blend of both, or the BTEC Diploma – a first in Singapore.

This puts students on the right path to prepare them for life at leading universities worldwide.

INDIVIDUALIZED PATHWAY

Advanced Placement /Diploma Program /Stamford Courses

Students may take any combination of AP, DP and stamford courses, provided they meet basic Stamford credit requirements. While students complete all the same coursework, they may choose wether or not to take external final exams. This pathway offers the most flexibility to the student because it can be designed to be at any level of difficulty and rigor.

IBDP PATHWAY

International Baccalaureate Diploma Program

Students choose one subject from each of six 'groups', with some special clauses. Students must choose three subjects at Higher Level (HL) and three subjects at Standard Level (SL). All six courses run for two years. This pathway is sometimes referrred to as the full DP.

APID PATHWAY

Advanced Placement International Diploma

Students complete at least five one-year AP courses in a broad range of subjects. The five AP courses must be from two different language courses, one that offers a 'global perspective,' one from either the sciences or mathematics and a fifth one that cannot be another language. The student must take and pass the AP Final Exams. Students usually complement this with other two-year DP courses.

BTEC PATHWAY

Business & Technical Education Council Program

Students taking the full BTEC must take the classes for two years. Students not taking the full BTEC may take classes for two years or one, and may change courses at the end of first year. This pathway is created through the Business & Technical Education Council (UK) and is the equivalent to 1-3 A-Levels (AP classes) depending on size.

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College Counseling

TAKING THE NEXT STEPS WITH CONFIDENCE

There is a great deal of uncertainty and confusion surrounding college admissions, particularly to the most selective institutions. Our College Counseling program offers support for both students and parents as they make the transition, providing the information and guidance they need for a successful and positive college application.

This process should be an exciting time of self-discovery and exploration, and we encourage students to focus on fin ding the 'right college match.' That means identifying and applying to colleges and universities where they will be intellectually challenged and socially engaged; schools which will encourage and inspire them as global learners, thinkers, and citizens.



Bilingual, biliterate & bicultural programs for citizens of the world

Fluency in multiple languages equips students with the skills and cultural literacy to navigate and lead in a global community. And with Singapore's geographic location, students are uniquely placed to take advantage of a multi-lingual life.

Stamford American accommodates global language learning for children as young as 18 months. Through our World Language Program, we offer daily instruction in 3 of the world's most widely spoken languages—Mandarin, Spanish and English. Those looking to dedicate more time and



Daily Mandarin or Spanish

FROM 18 MONTHS TO 11 YEARS

Every child in our Early Learning Village and Elementary School receives daily Mandarin or Spanish lessons as part of the language curriculum. In Secondary School, these classes become more intensive 80-minute sessions every other day.

Progress is measured through 9 levels for Spanish and 7 levels for Mandarin. Students are given the scope to learn at their own pace and are assessed on Standards-Based Measurement of Proficiency (STAMP).

Bilingual Mandarin and English

FROM 3 TO 10 YEARS

Students looking to be fully immersed in dual language learning during their daily classroom experience may choose to join the Bilingual Program. Available at no extra cost, the program gives learners equal exposure to English and Mandarin in both the subject matter as well as concepts taught within their grade. Student outcomes include being able to read, write and communicate orally in both Mandarin and English.

Classes are taught by bilingual, biliterate and bicultural teachers who fully engage with students as they master both languages.

Mother Tongue Program

FOR ALL AGES

As a global community where we welcome, celebrate, honor and respect all cultures, Stamford American realizes the importance of the mother tongue. Children learn from the community they are exposed to and having a strong network that includes language brings a better appreciation of their own culture and home.

Delivered through its thriving diverse community, Stamford American offers optional after-school mother tongue programs for all children. Led by our parents and wider international community, 12 different mother tongue programs area available weekly on our campus.

Children in the program have access not only to native teachers but to classroom facilities, IT support, library and event space to host special activities.

Stamford American boasts two bespoke, state-of-the-art campuses, both centrally located less than 10 minutes' drive from downtown Singapore.

These physical environments support our holistic learning philosophy, that of an open and vibrant community, and an appreciation for not just diverse age groups, but also different learning styles as well as cultures.

1st Campus: Elementary & Secondary at Woodleigh

- Expansive teaching and learning environments for Elementary and Secondary students from age 6 to 18 years
- Dedicated Innovation Center for hands-on learning and the opportunity to explore the latest technology in the market
- ▶ 500-seat Reagan Theater with professional lighting, sound equipment and 60sqm LED screen
- Extensive sports facilities including 3 swimming pools, 2 air-conditioned indoor sports arenas, rooftop tennis courts, dance studios, rock-climbing walls, a full-size sports field and Golf Academy









Inspired by the philosophy of Reggio Emilia, the Early Learning Village is built on the simple principle that the environment nurtures the child. Located just 2.6km from the Woodleigh Campus, this extraordinary facility is purpose built for our early learners aged 18 months to 6 years (Pre-Nursery to KG2).

- Pre-K onwards, the curriculum is grounded in the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Program (IBPYP) integrated with new units of inquiry.
- 6 large outdoor play areas with 75% UV cover to spark imagination and play
- 20-meter swimming pool with varying depths to encourage new swimmers
- Air-conditioned indoor multi-purpose "Hive" arena for sports and performances
- Light and airy classrooms with attached dedicated age level discovery spaces

AN INVIDUALIZED, FULLY INTERNATIONAL PATHWAY

Unparalleled choice delivering real competitive advantage

Stamford American International School is the only school in Singapore to offer Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IB DP) and Business and Technical Education Council (BTEC) Diploma curricula. Students graduate with a US accredited Stamford High School Diploma alongside the opportunity to pursue the IB Diploma, AP International Diploma or BTEC Diploma that is aligned closely to their ambitions and future university or career plans.

With these overarching frameworks, the best of American and international curricula is combined in a unique blend for a guaranteed, responsive education. Through the AERO Standards, students are ensured of vertically aligned, connected learning within discipline areas. Through the IB Programme frameworks, students involve themselves as inquirers across disciplinary and interdisciplinary learning in order to construct and personalize their learning.

Learning Principles

Our curriculum design focuses on learning experiences that encompass:

- Multiple entry points and pathways for learning
- Personal engagement and challenge for each individual learner
- Exploration of student inquiries and multiple perspectives
- Interdisciplinary connections to local and global contexts
- Conceptual learning that reaches beyond knowing, to deep understanding
- Development of skills and approaches to learning that support lifelong learning



IB World Schools share a common philosophy— a commitment to high quality, challenging, international education. The Stamford American curriculum offers the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP), the IB Middle Years Programme (MYP) and the IB Diploma Programme (DP).

(IB) PROGRAMMES

IB Primary Years Programme (PYP): Early Years & Elementary School

The IB PYP is for students between the ages of 3 and 12 years and focuses on the development of the whole child as an inquirer, both in the classroom and in the world outside.

International-mindedness and a positive attitude to learning are encouraged, by developing their awareness of the process of learning so that they become lifelong learners. As a reflection of real life, the program encourages learning beyond traditional subjects through meaningful, in-depth examination into real issues. This emphasizes the development of the whole student physically, intellectually, emotionally and ethically.



IB Middle Years Programme (MYP): Middle School

The IB MYP is for students between the ages of 11 and 16 years and provides a philosophical framework with a holistic approach to education and a rigorous framework for assessment.

The aim of the MYP is to educate the whole person and to show the impact of each individual on the world around them. The MYP fosters intercultural awareness and the importance of communication. Its goal is to constantly place learning within a context, and to make explicit the relationship between various disciplines.

IB Diploma Programme (DP): Secondary School

We are a non-selective and inclusive school which offers a unique pathway to suit students and their interests. Each student graduates with a US High School Diploma as well as the opportunity to pursue the International Baccalaureate (IB) or Advanced Placement (AP) Diploma — the only school in Singapore to offer this unique pathway.

The IB Diploma Programme is recognized by universities in 124 countries and is designed to be taken over two years (between the ages 16-19). The DP includes six academic subjects and a core syllabus consisting of the extended essay, theory of knowledge and CAS (creativity, action and service). Students study two modern languages, a humanities or social science subject, an experimental science, mathematics or computer science, and another subject including the arts.

The core frameworks that guides the crafting of our curriculum - the International Baccalaureate Programme (IB) along with the American Standards and the College Board's Advanced Placement program – provide teaching and learning that is student-centered.

Our Curriculum Team, which consists of Program Coordinators in the MYP, DP, AP and BTEC and an Executive Director of Teaching and Learning, works alongside our experienced, professional faculty to develop curriculum throughout all divisions of the school.




Music

Visual Arts

ART THROUGH CULTURE AND TRADITIONS

Visual art enables students to communicate in powerful ways that go beyond their spoken language, helping to develop an understanding of their local and global community.

For the Primary Years Programme (PYP) from KG1 to Grade 5 at Stamford American, visual arts is designed to foster creativity and self-discovery in order to develop the students' ability to relate to visual aesthetics and concepts through the creation, and responding to artwork.

In the Middle Years Programme (MYP), Grade 6 through 10 students will acquire an understanding of the inquiry cycle; developing research, inspiration, ideation, creative thinking, and responding skills.

For students in Grade 11 and 12 who are moving on to the IB DP, the visual arts course encourages students to challenge their own creative and cultural expectations and boundaries.

Students from Stamford American are selected to showcase their artwork in the annual International Schools Art Exhibition. Stamford American is a proud participant in the SEASAC Arts Festival, an opportunity for students to be creative with like-minded peers across South-East Asia. The Artist in Residence Program exposes students each year to accomplished artists who act as mentors to students.

Encompassing over 350 activity choices throughout the year for students from Pre-K to Grade 12, they range from financial market trading to Calligraphy; Model United Nations to Aerospace and many many more.

THE WORLD AS OUR CLASSROOM

We inspire all our students at Stamford American to grow into responsible global citizens and leaders. Through this program, students fulfil part of the academic curriculum within challenging but enriching environments outside of their regular classrooms. From Grade 3 onward, students join annual field trips and educational tours where they learn to collaborate, communicate and innovate through different outdoor activities. Our goal is to nurture leadership, confidence, compassion and ecological awareness.





Rare Tree Forest — Developing Ecological Sustainability

A new Rare Tree Forest site involving planting endangered species of trees indigenous to the region and Singapore at the Stamford American Woodleigh campus. What started as an initiative for the Grade 9 Science Curriculum and the Field Studies Program has now become a whole school project in creating ecological sustainability. For our students to be able to connect with nature in an authentic way

Stamford American Goes Green with Solar

As part of a school-wide effort to be more environmentally friendly, as well being an opportunity to teach the benefits of clean energy, students from Stamford American collaborated with Sun Electric to install 845 solar panels on the schools' Woodleigh campus rooftop. Capable of producing about 426 MWh of solar electricity yearly and offsetting about 200 metric tons of carbon, the solar panels supplement Stamford American's current electricity usage as well being available for use by homeowners through Sun Electric's SolarSpace platform.

Sleeping Out in Solidarity - The World's Big Sleep Out initiative

To raise awareness of homelessness and the refugee predicament worldwide, a pioneering group of 16 Grade 11 and 12 students as well as 4 teachers took part in their first ever Sleep Out on school premises, as part of the World's Big Sleep Out held across 52 cities, with over 50,000 people taking part. After setting up 'camp' on the school tennis courts, the Stamford students settled in to what was an uncomfortable insight into what it was like to sleep in the open.













Innovation thru collaboration

Stamford American prides itself on introducing the latest and most appropriate technology incorporated into a practical and forward-thinking curriculum. We harness technology to accelerate innovation in teaching and learning, and inspire learners to reach their greatest potential.

Through our Digital Learning Leaders, Stamford American teachers and students have the opportunity to develop new age skills using tools such as Virtual and Augmented Reality (VR / AR), Digital 3D Designs, Robotics, 3D printers and Laser Cutters.

The educational focused and dedicated Digital Learning Team ensures that any technology is integrated purposefully and authentically to add value to our students learning experiences. We also focus on upskilling our school community to adapt to the changing nature of technology and modern learning.



ADDITIONAL SUPPORT FOR THOSE WITH THE DRIVE TO SUCCEED

English as an Additional Language (EAL)

ENGLISH FOR NON-NATIVE SPEAKERS FROM 5 TO 16 YEARS

Our English as an Additional Language (EAL) program is designed to support non-native English speakers to successfully access our Stamford curriculum. We promote a "can do" attitude to inspire confidence and celebrate the diversity students bring with them to our community. Designed for 5 to 16 year olds of any nationality, to gain a high level of English proficiency for their studies at Stamford and beyond.

Stamford American offers 2 programs for different levels of proficiency:

Mainstream EAL for mid- to high-level English language learners, available from Kindergarten 2 to Grade 10.

The Mainstream EAL Program is for the mid to high level English language learner who require additional support with the aim to successfully access the IB and US curriculums at their age appropriate grade level, while functioning well at a peer group level academically, socially and culturally.

Students in Mainstream EAL benefit from integration with their classmates, while a co-teaching/co-planning model capitalizes on specific strengths and expertise of the specialist EAL teacher, the homeroom and subject teachers. This provides a greater teacher to student ratio, and allows additional 1 to 1 and small group support for students in the classroom when needed.

Sheltered EAL for students who need more specialized support, available from Kindergarten 2 to Grade 8.

The Sheltered EAL Program is for beginning English language learners who need specialized support to gain the proficiency level needed in order to access the IB and US curriculums. Our goal is to transition them into a mainstream classroom as soon as they can reach an appropriate level of academic English.

Students receive daily specialized English classes with an EAL specialist teacher. Our Sheltered EAL students also benefit from a co-teaching and co-planning model.

The EAL specialist in conjunction with the homeroom teacher, teacher assistant and subject teacher, provide a safe and comfortable environment for these beginning English language learners.

Student Support Department (SSD)

TAILORED PROGRAMS TO HELP ALL CHILDREN SUCCEED

- Speech-Language Therapists (SLT) & Occupational Therapists (OT)
- Counselors
- School Psychologist
- Academic Support Teachers, Interventional Specialists, and Special Education Teachers

The Student Support Department (SSD) provides support to students, families, and faculty so that every student achieves their own unique future regardless of any academic, physical, development and/ or social emotional challenge they may experience. We utilize a Response to Intervention (RTI)/ Multi Tiered Systems of Support Model of support which is a systematic and data-based method for identifying, defining, and supporting students' academic and/or behavioral needs. The Student Support Department regularly screens all students' academic and behavioral data so we can proactively address student concern. Our divisional support teams at each school consists of school counselors, Speech-Language Therapists (SLT), Occupational Therapists (OT), early interventionists, as well as academic, behavioral, and individualized student support teachers. These teams are available to parents and teachers as a resource for consultation as well as direct service providers for students. This multidisciplinary team approach ensures that students are successful across their school day. Therapists (OT), early interventionists, as well as academic, behavioral, math extension, and individualized student support teachers.
